Top Accomplishments

Transformed a donated airport building into an exhibits shop and received numerous donations of tools and furnishings to outfit the building.

Upgraded communications: new phone system, new audio-visual system in the meeting room, and new blog, "The Back-Stay."

Worked with a digitization consultant and prepared a major federal grant application to fund a photo digitization pilot project.

Celebrated 25 years of "Sheep to Shawl" with 706 students from 23 elementary-school classes.

Morphed the secretary's position from behind-the-scenes to front-desk reception and museum store manager.

Began processing the papers of Ernie Deane, including his research files, correspondence, and complete sets of *Arkansas Traveler* and *Ozarks Country* columns.

Completed a site survey, architectural drawings, and cost estimates for interior renovation of the Shiloh Meeting Hall.

Became a Washington County Master Gardeners sanctioned project.

Installed more than 43 running feet of new shelving for bulky collection items such as spinning wheels, furniture, and saddles.

Featured the exhibit Arkansas/ Arkansaw: A State and Its Reputation, exploring Arkansas's hillbilly image, produced by the Old State House Museum in Little Rock.





Civil War Sesquicentennial

To commemorate the 150th anniversary of the Civil War, in 2012 the museum:

Offered the symposium "Other Voices: Civil War in the Ozarks," which explored the homefront experiences of women, African Americans, Native Americans, and members of the Peace Society, grant funded by the Arkansas Civil War Sesquicentennial Commission.

Mounted the exhibit "Nothing but sorry, trouble, and worry," based on memories of people in the Ozarks during the Civil War.

Researched and developed a new school program on Civil War medicine.

Received funding from the Northwest Arkansas Economic Development District and the Arkansas Civil War Sesquicentennial Commission (thanks to Sen. Jon Woods) for a Civil War Sesquicentennial marker for Springdale, to be erected in 2013.

Recorded three podcasts about the Ozark Civil War homefront for inclusion on the Arkansas Civil War Sesquicentennial Commission website.

Coordinated a public Civil War event at Fayetteville's Town Center under an Arkansas Civil War Sesquicentennial Commission grant.

The education staff developed a lifesized replica of a covered wagon to provide an experiential component to their "Log Cabins and Covered Wagons" program.

We hosted five school and family reunions, three book signings, and a holiday violin concert.

The new Common Core Curriculum was incorporated into all school programs.

We improved our flower beds, planted herbs, built a compost pile, planted sassafras, possumhaw, and redbud trees, installed split-rail fencing donated by Pea Ridge National Military Park, and got a spiffy new riding lawn mower.
